COVID-19 SECURE

When the government advises that it is safe for sporting events to resume, it is likely that cases of COVID-19 will continue to occur in the community. With this in mind Stocksbridge Park Steels FC remain committed in aligning itself and working closely with current guidelines and restrictions to ensure the safety of all users of the clubs facilities.

As the government continues to plan and prepare for further loosening of restrictions we want to do everything possible to enable our users, players, managers, coaches, helpers and spectators to return to sport safely and responsibly.

Stocksbridge Park Steels FC have put together a detailed Risk Assessment portfolio which sets out its COVID-19 aims, objectives, plans and arrangements for both its facilities and its users.

This portfolio sets the benchmark for COVID-19 compliance at this time and will be communicated, clearly and regularly with its members and participants, setting out what the club is doing to manage risk and to what advice is given to individuals.

SPSFC are committed to protect people from harm, this includes taking reasonable steps to protect all users and participants from COVID-19.

We have identified activities and / or situations that may cause transmission of the virus and have given thought of who could be at risk. We have decided how likely it is that someone could be exposed and acted to remove the activity or situation, or indeed control the risk.

Measures and Controls, particularly for matchdays at Bracken Moor have needed to be innovative but with a flexibility in mind in case of a sudden governmental relaxation in guidelines and restrictions.

GUIDANCE FOR USERS OF BRACKEN MOOR STADIUM AND ASSOCIATED PITCHES

Football Activities

These guidelines have been produced in line with the Governments "COVID 19" advice issued on 1st June 2020 which saw the easing of lockdown measures and restrictions, together with a phased return of outdoor sports and recreation.

This easing of restrictions has enabled SPSFC to cautiously recommence football related activities.

The Club is aware that "BAME" (Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic) people may be at greater risk from COVID 19. Based on this information any person that fits this criteria should make a personal decision as to whether the time is right to re start playing, coaching, watching or helping. If anyone is in doubt, or you are not comfortable returning to football, in whatever capacity...then don,t!

Training Sessions

ONE METRE PLUS

Government and FA guidelines must be followed...

- Football training and fitness activities must be conducted in groups of no more than six.
- When distancing of two metres is possible then this should be met, if not then one metre is acceptable.
- Physical contact with anyone outside your household is <u>not</u> permitted, therefore playing of any games, small sided or full is not allowed at this time
- As a Club we ask all players, managers, coaches, helpers and spectators to support this
 initiative, if you are not happy with the arrangements that have been made then remove
 yourself from that environment.

<u>Arriving at the Training Session</u>

- Wherever possible you should arrive changed and ready.
- Changing rooms are closed.
- Avoid congregating in the car park
- Use hand sanitiser or bring / use your own, before handling balls and equipment. Running water is available if you need it.
- Toilet facilities may be available but SPSFC encourage people to try and use one at home.
- If you have any additional medical needs you must ensure that you discuss them specifically with the coach or manager so that the Club can accommodate wherever possible, in accordance with current COVID 19 guidance.

At and During the Session

- Bibs must not be used unless they can be washed in between each session and must not be shared at any point during a session.
- Avoid touching balls and equipment with your hands ie discs, cones, goals...etc. Equipment should be handled as little as possible by as few people as possible

- Refrain from spitting...Coughing and sneezing must be into the elbow joint / upper sleeve area and don,t touch your face. Tissues used must be disposed into the bins that are provided.
- Balls should be wiped with disinfectant wipes at regular periods throughout the session.
- Goal posts wiped with disinfectant wipes at regular intervals throughout the session.
- Use your own water bottles, do not share water bottles...identify your own water bottle.
- If you get injured during the session a member of your household can assist you if present, if not the squads qualified first aider will attend.
- First aider will wear mask / face covering and gloves when attending to an injured player.
- If you become symptomatic during a session you should immediately remove yourself from the session and return home.

After the Session

- Leave the venue...do not congregate in the car parks, near to the gates or on the pitches...please avoid any sort of congestion.
- Wash your hands at the earliest opportunity and thoroughly clean any personal equipment with disinfectant wipes.
- Showers after training is <u>not</u> permitted
- Wash your kit

| The away team and staff will arrive at the ground and park in the designated spaces near to the back car park door. They will be shown how to enter the Bracken Moor facility and given clear COVID protocol instructions. The away team, staff and officials will enter the building and use the away changing room. The corridor to the home changing rooms and referees room will be barriered off. Visiting Officials will use the players caged tunnel / outer staircase and observe SPSFC COVID protocol once at pitch level. Officials will not be invited into the committee room for corporate refreshments. Once the game has finished the away team will exit the ground as they came in and will not partake in drinks or food at the bar or kitchen. Showers can be taken by players after the game but distancing within the COVID parameters must be met. | Controls required |

| The home kit and associated equipment should be laid out at least two hours prior to kick off or earlier if possible. All equipment includingpump,water bottles and carriers, bag handles, wipe board, balls etc should be wiped down with disinfectant wipes prior to use and then re wiped for storage after use. When conducting Secretarial work prior to kick off a limit of two people should be observed in the control room at any one time. Work surfaces and high touch points should be wiped down before using the room. When meeting opposition officials and game officials social distancing of one metre plus must be observed with no formal handshakes allowed. | Controls required |
| Gary Ward (Kit man) suffers from Cerebral Palsy (CP) (Moderate Risk category) Having CP does not necessarily put someone at higher risk of getting infected, however if a person with CP has any associated conditions that affects the immune or respiratory systems this could affect the ability to deal with the virus. If this is the case for Gary then further preventative measures need to be introduced to further minimise exposure. As Belt and Braces Gary should wear PPE ie disposable gloves and a face covering when conducting his kit man duties. GF (Chairman) to speak with GW. | Additional controls required |
